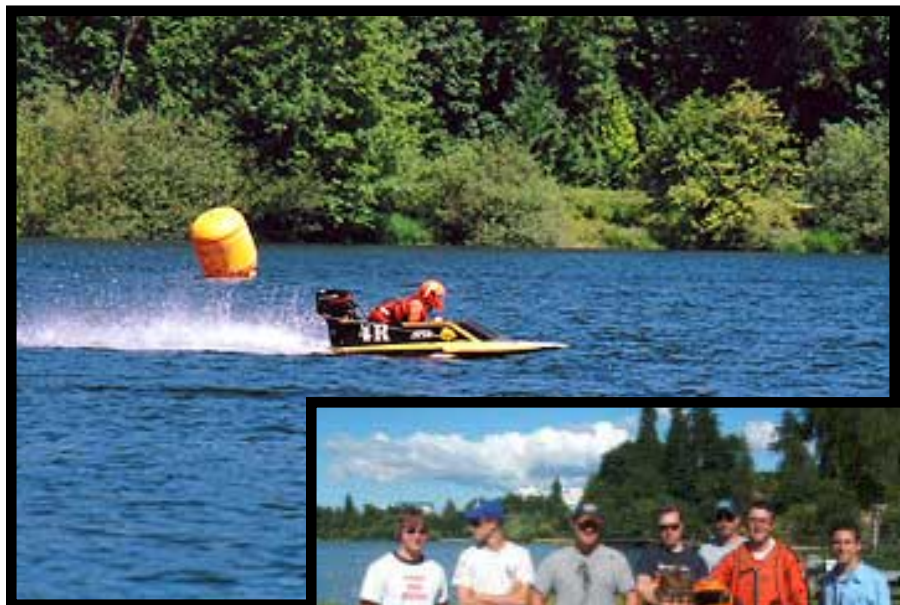

NEW DRIVERS TAKE LAPS AT CAPITOL

SOA opened the door to new boat racers Friday of Capitol Lake race weekend.

Though the idea of organizing a test session to give a taste of racing to interested non-racers had been investigated by SOA in the past, most racing sites weren't considered suitable. SOA's return to centrally located Capitol Lake after the long layoff following the 2001 earthquake damage to the Marathon Park pits provided the needed stage.



The bulk of new drivers came from a sign-up list set up at the SOA display for the Lake Union Wooden Boat Festival, though others came in through other contact. A team made up of Dwight Malhiot, Rocky Peterson and Steve Greaves got drivers outfitted, into boats and onto the course, sending 15 people (eight pictured at right) out for their first laps in a race-boat. Among those who took their first ride was a reporter from the Olympian (in kevlar's with helmet) there to

scout a story, and who followed up with a weekend of great articles on the race. Three who took first rides Friday came back on the weekend to race.

She said that as of meeting night he was able to get up and around and navigate stairs carefully, but was frustrated by some restrictions such as being limited to lifting only 5 to 15 pounds rather than the outboard he wants to lift. Unlimited pits, and according to K-Dub in a KIRO-TV interview needed only a couple review lessons in TV remote operation to be set for race day.

Old Business:

Warden Lake:

A variety of voices reported that Warden lake was a great new site and will be greater site if more of us support it. Ryan Johnson reports eight classes run per day and a good course nicely protected from wind by bluffs.

Capitol Lake:

Another solid weekend of racing on Capitol Lake, starting with Friday's new Driver test session in which a few SOA members teamed to dress, instruct and send 15 people out for their first rides in a race boat. The test drivers included a reporter from the Olympian, who followed up with a great article on his first-ride experience, and the race in Saturday's Olympian and more coverage Sunday. And on Sunday, four test drivers came back to race. The event pulled in 103 racers Saturday and 93 Sunday.



Lawrence Lake:

Jan Shaw told members that the course size goal for Lawrence was 1-2/3 mile if water levels stand. There'll be Friday testing, with the last hour reserved for the kids and, of course, Pushboat Nationals.

2007 Nationals:

Dave Anderson reported that while at Warden He and Debi Perman looked over Best Western's facilities for banquet

Location and other uses and approved of what was shown. Dave also reviewed the race site and is noting layout and changes there as well. Dave says he's a little concerned with layout for inspection and notes that park officials are wary of vegetation removal, and some shoreline plants might present us with an access problem. Dave has people lined up to handle facilities construction, and he's currently lining up officials. He plans another committee meeting following Wakefield. Dave also showed T-shirts Made up by Jan Shaw that noted 2007 Stock Nationals at Moses Lake, and that SOA Members will wear at Wakefield. Finally, Dave cautions that in every talk he's had with park officials, they've been emphatic in declaring that alcohol will not be tolerated in the park, and been insistent in asking SOA to make the no alcohol policy clear.

CAPITOL LAKE

Our second Capitol Lake weekend of the post-quake era featured sunny skies, an extra day for testing and new driver rides, and some great racing for spectators lining the in-town lakeshore. On Friday the team of Dwight Malhiot, Rocky Peterson and Steve Greaves conducted an SOA hydro-school, sending 15 people out for their first laps in a race-boat. Three drivers who drove Friday came back on the weekend to race.

For the most part racers stayed in their boats, Though rookie racer Sean Byrne made a strong effort for Hell-Divers points with two trips out, first, blowing out a cockpit side after finding a hole, He falling out of Kyle Bahl's back-up loaner in 20ss. Sean continued to run, adjusted to the boat and ending up with trophies. And Russ Bircher scared us all in FEH as he vanished into a roostertail in the first turn, reappeared then vanished again, then came soaring straight up. Russ was pitched out about 20 feet up and the heat was stopped. Russ was OK, though the boat was beat up.

And getting Sean out to race again was a show in itself. When racers realized Sean's boat was out for the weekend, four racers

made boats available, and Kyle Bahl's Back-up C-Stock was selected and set up with Sean's motor in about 7 minutes to put him into the re-run.

Jon Peterson surprised racers by flying in Friday night from Fort Benning, GA, to race FEH and D-Mod Saturday then fly back To Benning Sunday.

A major weekend show was put on by Troy Holmberg and Ron Jones Jr. as changes to the afterplane of Ron's composite rocket were made with a good eye and a saws-all and followup try-outs were rewarded with dramatic improvements in speed and handling, culminating in a dramatic final D-Stock heat on Sunday with Kyle Bahl driving through the pack to second.

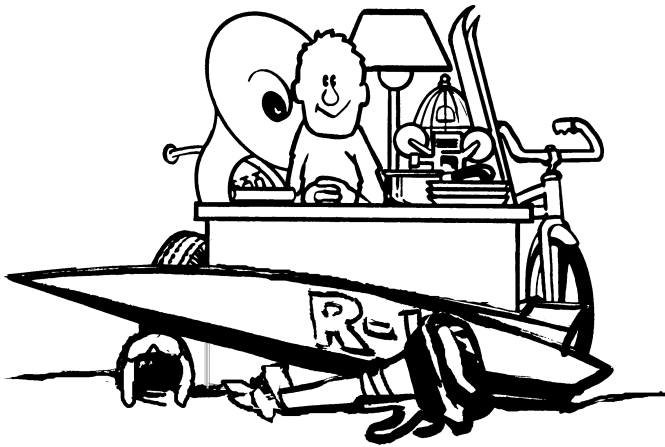
2006 Lawrence Lake Push Boat Nationals
